- Writing style and chapter structure are more undergraduate-friendly; some of the more technical linguistics content streamlined/removed; additional graphics to illustrate key concepts

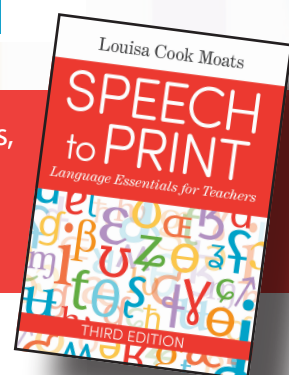
