What Your Students Might Want You to Know

Listen to me. Learn from me. Hear me. Be there, but give me space. Hear me. SUPPORT Ask me questions. LET ME FAIL SOMETIMES. BELONGING. Ask, "What supports might help you?" Facilitate friendships. Expect that I will learn. Encourage independence. Plan outrageously fun lessons. Always speak kindly. Ask, "What do you need?" If I am loud, be quiet. WHEN I AM HAPPY, Handle me with care. **REJOICE WITH ME.** Be gentle. Remember, I am a person first. Attribute the best possible motive consistent with the facts. Encourage interdependence. HELP ME CONNECT WITH OTHER STUDENTS. Allow us to create together, laugh together, and have fun together. ASSUME FRIENDSHIP IS POSSIBLE. Engage me. **BE TRUSTWORTHY.** |f | am sad, Know I am unsure. Spark curiosity. wipe my tears. Be respectful. Assume competence always. Do not control. Be a learner yourself. Let me learn with other students.

Share positive stories with my parents. ASK, 'HOW CAN / BEST HELP YOU?" ENCOURAGE SOFTLY. Set me up to be successful. Lead by loving. Be positive. Redirect softly. STEP Challenge me. Follow my lead. Fade your support. BACK. WHEN / HAVE DIFFICULTIES, KINDLY REDIRECT.
